



DEMOCRATIC AUDIT BOUNDARY MODEL FOR GREATER LONDON

London's parliamentary representation falls from 73 to 68 in the boundary changes. The margin between it receiving 68 seats and 69 was very close, with the result that the average size of a London constituency is rather high at 77,454 electors, around 1 per cent in excess of the standard UK quota. As a result, the room for manoeuvre is less in London than elsewhere – effectively 4 per cent variation rather than 5 per cent. This makes it practically impossible to give whole numbers of seats to more than a couple of boroughs, and also next to impossible to split London up into small groups of three or four boroughs. Although there are some such groupings that look possible, fitting them into a pattern that works for London as a whole is usually extremely difficult.

The plan here accomplishes several objectives for drawing boundaries in London.

- No wards were split in the making of this production. This is difficult to accomplish in London given that most wards are fairly large (6-10,000) and the tighter than usual arithmetic.
- No constituency crosses the River Thames.
- No constituency is composed of parts of more than two boroughs.
- There are only two 'orphan' wards, i.e. single ward from a borough in a seat dominated by another borough.
- It is based on reasonably coherent borough groupings, particularly south of the Thames.

The borough groupings are as follows:

North:

- Waltham Forest (2 seats)
- Havering, Barking & Dagenham, Redbridge, Newham, Tower Hamlets, Hackney, Haringey, Islington (15 seats)
- City, Westminster, Camden, Barnet, Enfield, Brent, Harrow, Hillingdon, Kensington & Chelsea, Hammersmith & Fulham, Ealing, Hounslow (22 seats)

South:

- Bromley (3 seats)
- Richmond, Kingston (3 seats)
- Lambeth, Croydon, Sutton, Merton, Wandsworth (12 seats)
- Bexley, Greenwich, Lewisham, Southwark (9 seats)

London is likely to face major reorganisations every time boundaries are reviewed in future. The map presented here for 68 seats on the December 2010 numbers looks very different from the draft plans based on the 2009 numbers. Many constituencies are bumping up against the maximum number of electors – 11 out of 68 have over 80,000 electors. Relatively small changes in registered electorate would make many of these seats impossible. In addition, London has the highest concentrations of under-registered groups, and probably the least stable and complete electoral registers as it is, even before the introduction of individual registration.

Because the established relationship between borough boundaries and constituencies has to be broken up, the following table is offered as a guide through the model constituencies. Constituencies are grouped into five sub-regions of London in the table below.
